1. Start your Hunt at **301 South St. Asaph Street**, where

Washington's close friend and Revolutionary War hero the Marquis de Lafayette stayed during his month-long visit to Alexandria in 1824.

What color are the shutters on the front windows?

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2. George and Martha
Washington dined at **601 Duke**with his friend Benjamin Delaney
after the Revolutionary War, and
Lafayette is believed to have
spoken to welcoming
Alexandrians from the steps of
this house during his 1824 visit because its steps were higher
than those at 301 South St.
Asaph Street! How many front
steps are there?

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3. Martha Washington's niece
Fanny Bassett and Washington's
nephew George Augustine
Washington lived at **501 Duke**while they were married, and
Washington dined here when
Fanny was remarried to his
Secretary Tobias Lear. What is
the color of the gate to the front
yard?

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4. Pay your respects to the Unknown Soldier of the American Revolution in the cemetery behind the Old Presbyterian Meeting House at **323 South Fairfax**. What is the shape of the window on the wall above the tomb?

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5. Walk north to the corner of

South Fairfax and Prince and
look to your right upon the 18th
century homes lining Gentry
Row, which was inhabited by
wealthy merchants in
Washington's time -- including
some of his friends. What is the
color of the door of the dark
green townhouse at 217 Prince
Street?

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6. Continue walking north to 117
South Fairfax, where
Washington's close friend Dr.
James Craik once lived. Craik was chief physician and surgeon to the Continental Army and was the first doctor called to
Washington's bedside as he was dying. What material is Dr. Craik's house made of?

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7. Imagine walking with Dr. Craik to the Stabler-Leadbetter Apothecary Shop at **105-107 South Fairfax**, where he purchased his medicines. This was an apothecary shop for 141 years! When was it established?

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8. Cross over King Street to

Market Square, where a
committee chaired by
Washington met after the Boston
Tea Party to approve the Fairfax
Resolves, which contained a list
of colonists' constitutional rights
that later developed into the Bill
of Rights of the U.S. Constitution.
How many steps lead up from
King Street to the fountain?

9. Cross over Fairfax Street and go to the courtyard of the Alexandria Visitor Center at **221 King Street**. Washington dined often in this home with Scottish merchant William Ramsay and with William's son Dennis Ramsay. How many dormer windows are there on the second floor of the Ramsays' home?

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10. Look across King Street to the buildings on the **South Side of King between Fairfax and Lee**. Washington's beloved half-brother Lawrence bought those two half-acre lots when the city was established in 1749. What bank sits on the west corner of Lawrence's property?

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Rules for the Hunt for Washington

- 2. To pursue the Hunt from the beginning start at 607 Oronoco, go across the street to 617 Duke, walk east on Duke to South Fairfax, walk north on South Fairfax, cross King Street to Market Square, cross North Fairfax to Alexandria Visitor Center courtyard.
- 3. There are two versions of the Hunt, but each individual or group may enter only one Clue Sheet for the drawing for winners. Parents may assist their children.
- 4. All 10 clues must be answered correctly to be entered in the drawing for prizes.
- 6. Please do not use the internet to assist your search.
- 7. Of course, use care when crossing city streets.
